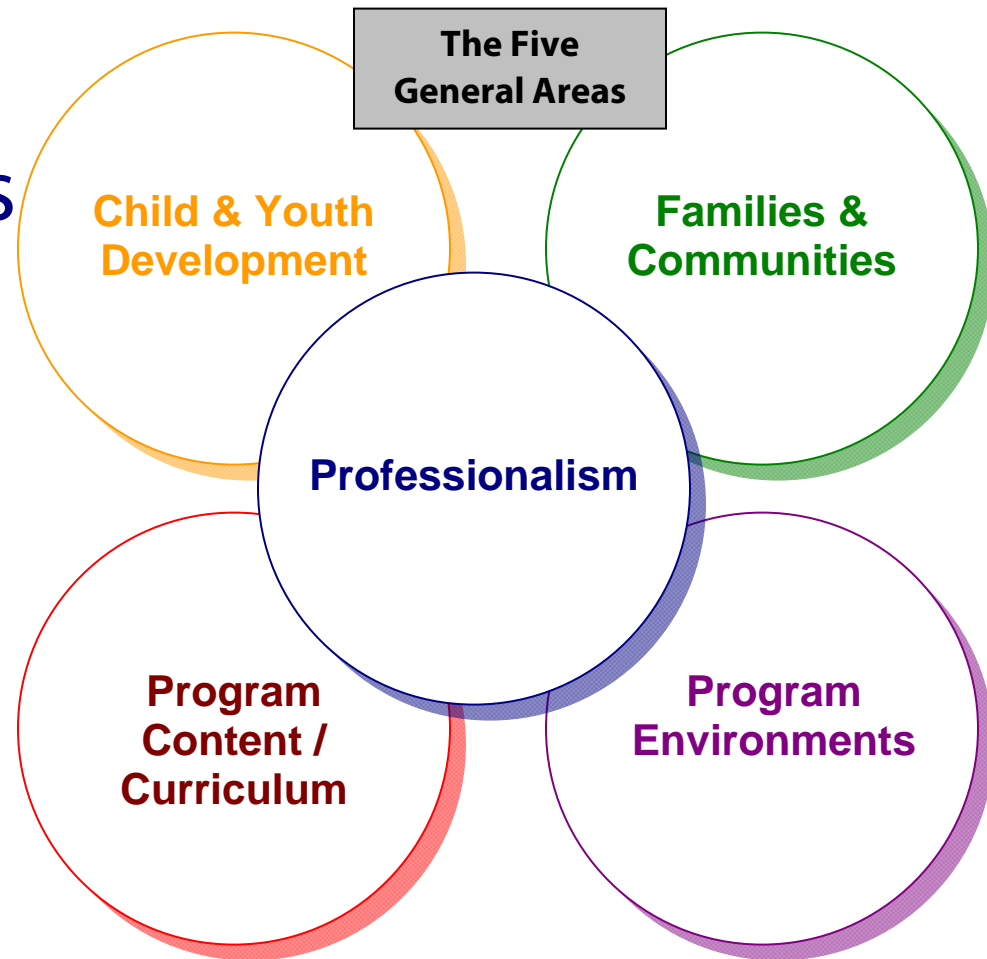




IYD Credential Core Competencies
